Stephens College Offers Scholarship to Morgan Youth

In 2010, the American Morgan Horse Association partnered with Stephens College, located in Columbia, Missouri, to offer an educational scholarship to a deserving incoming first-year female student.

By design, this alliance enables AMHA to directly influence the industry's young equine professionals. For Stephens College, attracting dedicated and passionate students through the gateway of the professional world is a winning combination. Each scholarship recipient will receive a \$5,000 equestrian leadership scholarship that can be reapplied for each year.

Prospective applicants will submit an equestrian application to AMHA in addition to applying for admissions to Stephens. Upon acceptance to the college, the Stephens College Equestrian Studies faculty will evaluate each applicant and choose the best fit for the program.

Potential candidates should possess the following:

- Passion for all things horse
- Academically oriented student interested in all phases of personal growth and development
- Community minded, interested and willing to be engaged in service activities
- Solid work ethic
- Desire to explore a profession in the equine industry
- AMHA Youth Member
- Breed and discipline involvement (showing, youth clubs, youth council; anything that shows involvement specifically within the Morgan community)
- Financial need

Morgan Reaches the 7,000 Mile Mark!

Mary Coleman and her 15.3-hand endurance gelding, Hawk's Neopolitan (Blazing Hawk x Merlin Lady Alicia), have set a new Morgan record in endurance competition. On April 16, Mary and her "Mighty Morgan" completed the 25-mile limited distance ride and became the only Morgan to garner 7,000 miles! That distance is like going from the East Coast to California and back again!

The distance riding world is dominated by Arabians and Hawk is the second horse in the 40-year history of the Eastern Competitive Trail Ride Association's (ECTRA) to reach this milestone. ECTRA sanctions competitive trail riding from Maine to Virginia with 500-plus members. Competitive rides and drives are from 25 to 100 miles. Mary and Hawk average 500 miles a year, and have competed in 19 states in every weather condition imagined!

"Hawk has had at least two retirement ceremonies with a third one planned," Mary wrote. "Sometimes, it is just hard to give up on a good thing. Finally, I have another Morgan going now and Hawk

will be the back-up horse. It definitely has been an incredible journey with Hawk, my horse of a lifetime!"

Congratulations to Mary and Hawk's Neopolitan on this incredible achievement!

AMHA High Point Morgan Award

The Morgan Open High-Point Award, sponsored by the American Morgan Horse Association, recognizes the highest-scoring Morgan in individual open competitions across the country. In 2011, more than 100 events will be offering this award to those exhibiting their registered Morgans against other breeds. (Editor's note: This Award will be offered at the PaMHC Open Show along with the Division championships.)

Reduced Registration Fees for Older Morgans Approved

Recognizing that a number of older Morgans that were not registered were being rescued in recent months, the Registry Committee desired to provide the people rescuing these horses with an opportunity to register the horses at a reduced fee. The Board voted unanimously to put the following reduced fee into effect immediately.

- The fee to register horses twenty-four (24) months of age and older at the time of registration is to be \$210 for members.
- This fee reduction is effective immediately through December 31, 2011.
- The reduced fee is available only to AMHA members (a membership application submitted with a registration application entitles the person submitting the application to receive the reduced fee).
- The postmark date will establish the fee (i.e., registrations already in progress and those received after December 31, 2011 are not eligible for the reduced fee.).
- Registration applications will be accepted for consecutive generations of unregistered Morgans.
- All other requirements for registration will apply, including DNA, signatures, and stallion service reports.

Although the purpose is to assist in the registration of rescued horses, the fee is available to all members for the registration of all Morgans over 24 months of age.

For the therapeutic riding, they have included a very special class. It is the U.P.H.A. Exceptional Challenge Cup class. The top ten finishers in the class will be entitled to an expenses paid trip to the national finals in the fall.

Two additional classes not shown on the prize list have been added to the show. They are an Open Hunt Seat Equitation qualifying class and the open hunt seat equitation championship. The qualifying class will be held on Saturday afternoon and the championship class will be held on Sunday.

Along with the All Breed Show, there will be a Cross Road Tack Fall Hunter/Jumper show on Sunday.

Do You Recognize This Mare?



The lady who rescued her would love to know who she is and something about her history. She writes:

"This may be a long shot, but I am trying to track down the background and registration for a Morgan mare my aunt purchased from an Indiana Horse Rescue facility a year ago. We believe she may have come from Pennsylvania...but possibly somewhere else in the Northeast.

"The information we've been able to gather so far is that she is probably about 24 years old and has had some significant training and was likely in a big show barn at some point. She may have had a serious injury to her right hip in her mid teens that led to her inability to compete at the level she was used to. Our guess is that she was shown mostly in the mid 90's.

Due to her age, a blood test was not able to provide us with her breeding history. The fact that her history is largely 'unknown' plays no role in her future. She is a wonderful, loving mare...full of personality and character and she has definitely found her forever home. I was hoping that the blaze on her face might be obvious to someone who knew her well. Any help you could provide would be greatly appreciated!! A Message from Your Region 2 Directors

Dear AHMA Members

The katydids have been heralding the end of summer since mid-July, but it's still hotter 'n Hades here in New Jersey, so I think their singing was a bit premature. But, if you think it's hot here, you should have been with us for our board meeting in Oklahoma earlier this month! Temps there were considered mild if they were below 100 degrees F. One day it was 109!!

It was great to have a good number of Region 2 members participating in the Town Hall meeting. There will be another Town Hall in conjunction with the November board meeting, please watch your AMHA news for the date and time.

I want to call your attention to an item in AMHA's Latest News (August 12) "USDA Seeks Comments on Animal Disease Traceability Proposed Rule". Please read the article and pass your comments on as provided.

Highlights from the August 2011 board of directors meeting include:

Bylaws:

Old Business: Survey & Ballot System Inc., has been retained for the 2012 election and nominations requests have been issued for regions 6, 7 and 8 and one Director At Large position.

New Business: The committee had a brief discussion about a topic raised at the May meeting: lack of participation and attendance by directors (Bylaw 4.17) and the difference in declaring a seat on the board "vacant" versus "removal" of a director. This discussion will continue at the November meeting after additional research.

Registry:

Registrar Erica Richard reported quarterly and YTD statistics for registration, transfers, DNA testing, parentage verification, and waived signatures, noting declines in all areas, except transfers, which were up slightly.

The Registrar provided a report from the recent inspection of the Swedish Morgan Horse Society related to reciprocity. The committee asked for clarification on a few points before agreeing to proceed.

A motion was made and passed to modify the registry rules and transfer forms to accurately reflect Rule 6. These changes were needed to reflect the recent changes to the frozen semen certificate.

The committee heard individual requests for fee clemency.

Finance:

The committee heard the VP Finance's report. He reminded everyone about the current economy's effects on AMHA's revenues, and asked that committee members and the board continue to look for ways to trim expenses and grow revenues.

The committee heard the Executive Director's report on 2011 balances and YTD finances. The AMHA second quarter financial report is available on the Members Only side of the web site under Financial Reports.

Old Business: Executive Director reported the July/August issue of The Network had been mailed to every household at a cost of roughly \$3561. Many thanks to the advertisers and sponsors that helped make this possible. The staff hopes to also produce and mail the Nov/Dec 2011 issue.

New Business: McSoley & McCoy provided a draft of the 2010 IRS 990 tax returns. This was reviewed and approved by the committee.

The committee passed a motion to name the Vermont Community Foundation as successor Trustee for the Registry Trust. The board had previously approved the transfer from TD Bank to VCF.

The chair asked the committee to give some thought for the November meeting to define the purposes and conditions of the "Rainy Day" fund, which now has approximately \$20,000.

Board meeting:

Reports were heard from all committee chairs. In addition to approving motions put forward from the standing committees, the board approved motions for life members and certificates of appreciation. Congratulations to all the recipients.

The board unanimously approved a motion to not renew the GN license agreement with AMHI which expires on 11/1/2012. AMHA anticipates that after November 1, 2012, current members of the GN show committee will be invited to serve on a new committee of a new licensee, and that a new licensee will adopt for use the policy manual the current show committee has used (with some potential changes, including the removal of the AMHI President as an ex-officio member). We anticipate that the new licensee will be the American Morgan Horse Charitable and Educational Trust.

The board unanimously approved a motion to modify the distribution of the proceeds from the Stallion Service Auction effective 1/1/2012 as follows: 40% to World Morgan Futurity, 40% to marketing and breed promotion, 15% to regional shows, and 5% to horse show grants to aid struggling shows.

New Business: In response to the VP of Finance's request to trim expenses, the board unanimously approved a motion to suspend audio taping at committee and board meetings. In addition to staff time to operate, transcribe, and post the recordings, updated equipment and software are needed. Minutes will continue to be provided on the Members Only side of the website.

The next quarterly board meeting will be November in Burlington VT. We hope you will be able to join us there.
